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Memo on Representativeness of the Panel Study of Income Dynamics

Without waiting for our revision of the weights after the eleventh year of interviewing, and without even adjusting the weights for families which have acquired a non-sample spouse (several hundred married split-offs plus some others), we produced the attached tables comparing the 1977 income and demographics from the March 1978 Current Population Survey with the Panel data, using Current Population Reports, Consumer Income, P-60, No. 117, December 1978.

The population size estimates in the CPS are adjusted to 1970 population census controls, and start with a much larger (56,000 household) sample, which had a 5% nonresponse rate and had 24% of the families where one or more members gave incomplete income information, and missing items had to be imputed from other similar families.

A much larger Survey of Income and Education in Spring 1976 by the Census collected data on 151,000 households, produced substantially higher income estimates than the CPS, using the same questionnaire format, but with many newly trained interviewers. Comparisons of those data with the Panel data are needed.

The only substantial demographic difference between the 1977 CPS and SRC data is the larger number of young people in the SRC and that will be altered when we adjust downward the weights of married splitoffs who are mostly young.

We also have higher income reports, which might well result both from the reinterview process and from the much lower rate of missing information that has to be assigned in the SRC Panel.

Overall, however, the distribution of the Panel sample on both income and the relevant demographic data is remarkably consistent with the official CPS data.

When the weights were first estimated, each digit accounted for about 400 households, but with attrition and population growth, dividing the CPS estimates of aggregate households by our aggregate weight indicates that each digit of the weight accounts for 488 households.
